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
Why do we need a new working model?




Low level services, education, training, co-operation, planning...

1. Better understanding of local needs

- Electronic welfare report
(Ministries programmes, indicators, local needs/example: report of villages)

2. Common targets – common resources

- Cross-functional working group in municipalities

3. Service packets of wellbeing and civil safety

- Using of all resources
(Municipality, other public sector, private sector, NGO's, projects)

4. Decision making and control

- Main targets to the annual fiscal and budget planning
- Service packets to the electronic welfare report
